CERT TRAINING JANUARY 26–27

Register on or before Wednesday, January 17. There is no cost for the class.

Lancaster County Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills. Response by local law, fire, and other officials in a disaster situation only goes so far. Having volunteers trained and ready to respond is critical for the positive outcome of a potential disaster.

Volunteers who complete 20 hours of training qualify for inclusion on the team. Training involves disaster response skills in fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

There is no cost for the three-day class. Those who would like to attend CERT class or who have questions may contact Teri Roberts at (402)435-2100 or teri@volunteerlinc.org. FEMA recognizes that 95% of the lives saved in the event of a disaster are those of neighbor helping neighbor.

THE ARRL INTERNATIONAL GRID CHASE

Get ready to kick off 2018 with a new year-long operating event!



You may not know this, but your station is in a Maidenhead grid square. The entire world is divided into thousands of these 1° latitude × 2° longitude squares, each one with a unique designation. They're all part of a geographic location system adopted in the 1980s at a meeting of the VHF Working Group in Maidenhead, England.

Unless you are a VHF enthusiast, this nugget of information may not mean much. But at 0000 UTC on January 1, 2018, the global Amateur Radio community will be very interested in grid squares.

GET IN THE CHASE

The objective of the ARRL International Grid Chase is simple: Work stations in as many grid squares as possible and upload your log data to ARRL's Logbook of The World. If you are not currently registered with Logbook of The World, this is a good reason to get started. Go to lotw.arrl.org/lotw-help/getting-started. Registration and uploading are free.

Every new grid square contact confirmed through Logbook of The World counts toward your monthly total, so you have an incentive to start the chase as soon as you ring in the New Year.

Just turn on your radio and start calling "CQ Grid Chase," or listen for others doing the same. Make the contact, enter it into your log, and you're on to the next.

At the end of each month, your totals on the Grid Chase leader board will reset to zero. Fear not, though. The online scoring system will maintain your monthly totals for a grand total at the end of the year, when an annual summary will be released and awards given to top finishers in various categories.

The ARRL International Grid Chase is open to all amateurs, regardless of location or license class. Any operating mode is eligible as well as every band, except 60 meters. You'll find the complete rules at www.arrl.org/aigc2018.

Take the Chase on vacation. Take a radio along when you travel and work new grid squares at your destinations. Even a handheld FM transceiver can be used to work a new square on a simplex frequency.

The ARRL online store (www.arrl.org/shop) also offers grid square maps of the US and Canada, as well as a grid square atlas of the entire world.

ALABAMA BICENTENNIAL CALL, AL2C

ALABAMA GOVERNOR KAY IVEY MAKES HAM RADIO DEBUT WITH STATE'S BICENTENNIAL CALL SIGN

Alabama Governor Kay Ivey made her Amateur Radio debut on December 14—the state's 198th birthday—at the same time becoming the first person to use the state's bicentennial call sign, AL2C. Alabama will celebrate its 200th anniversary in 2019, and AL2C will be on the air for two years as part of the statewide celebration.

"I'm very excited to see the hard work that has been in the works for some time now to promote Amateur Radio in concert with the Alabama Bicentennial celebration," said ARRL Alabama Section Manager JVann Martin, W4JVM, who was at the State Capitol for the event. "It was great to activate the brand-new call sign AL2C on Alabama's 198th birthday, and we look forward to many more activities to come as we build up to Alabama's 200th birthday."

The Alabama Bicentennial Amateur Radio Club set up a D-Star VHF station in the Old House Chamber at the Alabama State Capitol in Birmingham. After announcing the Alabama Bicentennial Schools Initiative, Governor Ivey proceeded to the radio station, initiating contact with the Lee County Emergency Management Agency. The governor discussed the Alabama Bicentennial over the air with Otto Arnoscht, N4UZZ, the AL2C Call Sign Trustee, serving as the control operator.

Also on hand were Alabama House of Representatives Public Information Officer Clay Redden, KC4YAU; Alabama ARRL Public Information Coordinator Ed Tyler, N4EDT; Autauga County Assistant Emergency Coordinator Trent Davis, KV4UZ, Alabama Bicentennial Amateur Radio Club Treasurer Jason Smith, W4EGR, and Alabama ARRL State Government Liaison Christopher Hall, K4LIA, who also serves as Autauga County ARES EC and as the president of Alabama Bicentennial Amateur Radio Club. Hall established the Alabama Bicentennial Amateur Radio Club and AL2C in July and has been working with the Alabama Bicentennial Commission to promote Alabama's Bicentennial.

On the other end of the conversation at Lee County Emergency Management Agency was Mike Watkins, WX4AL, the District Delta ARES Emergency Coordinator and Lee County ARES Emergency Coordinator.
