## HISTORICAL CIVIL WAR ROBBER'S CAVE TOUR

**SATURDAY, APRIL 14, 15:00**

Robber's Cave, located in Lincoln, dates back 150 years and had been closed since 2000 before Blue Blood Brewing Co. purchased it in 2015 and built a brewery and restaurant around its entrance. The cave was cleaned up, and in 2016, Blue Blood Brewing started offering tours. A lot of Lincolniters have fond memories of the cave, which is located south of 10th and High Streets at 925 Robber's Cave Road.

The 55-degree cave is about 500 feet long. According to legend, this cave had seen many uses over the years, including Pawnee Indians gatherings in the early years of the Nebraska Territory. The cave was also said to have been a way-station for slaves who escaped from the south via the Underground Railroad.

## ARRL NEWS UPDATE

### SPACE STATION'S SLOW-SCAN TELEVISION SYSTEM TO BE ACTIVE IN APRIL

The Amateur Radio Slow-Scan Television (SSTV) system on the International Space Station (ISS) is expected to be active in April on 145.800 MHz (FM). The Russian segment's MAI 75 SSTV has announced transmissions on Monday, April 2, 1505 – 1830 UTC, and on Tuesday, April 3, 1415 – 1840 UTC.

"Reviewing the crew schedule, the SSTV activity, which uses Amateur Radio on the International Space Station ([ARRL](#)) radios, was coordinated around ARISS school contacts and is listed for April 2 and April 3," said NASA ISS Ham Project Coordinator Kenneth Ransom, N5VHO.

The SSTV system, which uses the call sign RSOISS, is also expected to be active from April 11 – 14 worldwide to mark Cosmonautics Day in Russia on April 12. Specific transmission times are not yet available. Images on all dates will be related to the Soviet Union's *Interkosmos* cooperative space ventures project.

SSTV images will be transmitted in PD-120 format on 145.800 MHz (FM) using the Kenwood TM-D710 transceiver in the ISS Russian Service Module. ISS transmissions use the 5-kHz deviation FM standard. It's possible to receive SSTV transmissions with only a handheld transceiver and appropriate SSTV software: connect the audio output of the transceiver or a scanner to the soundcard of a Windows PC or an Apple iOS device. The free Windows application [MMSSTV](#) can be used to decode the signal. On Apple iOS devices, the [SSTV](#) app is available for compatible modes. For Linux systems, try [QSSTV](#).

This event is dependent on other activities, schedules, and crew responsibilities on the ISS and subject to change. Check for updates on the Amateur Radio on the International Space Station's ([ARRL](#)) [SSTV](#) [blog and picture gallery](#).

## MEET YOUR FELLOW HAM



In the 1960s, I joined a high school radio club and built Heath Kits. In 1973, I got my Technician class license and upgraded to Advanced in 1977. I was always interested in electricity and electronics. My dad was a mechanic, and I grew up working on cars.

In the Boy Scouts, the troop scoutmaster was an electrician. I was mesmerized by his stories of his work.

I graduated from Purdue University with a degree in electrical engineering technology in 1970. During the summers, I was an electrician helper at U.S. Steel in Gary, Indiana. That was where I got my interest in working with my hands. The two journeyman electricians I followed around were the best electricians I have ever worked with.

My first real job was with Northern Indiana Public Service Company in the engineering department. A fellow worker invited me to his New Year's Eve party, where I met my future wife, Diane. We moved to Nebraska in 1974.

We have a daughter, Jonna. She works in Washington, DC for the AFL-CIO. I worked in the engineering department at Lincoln Electric System, but I always thought about the hands-on part of electricity. I became a master electrician and worked at various plants in Lincoln. I worked at the Goodyear plant for 29 years along with OMC - Lincoln and Control Data Corporation. Articles on

my work have been published in *EC&M* and *Electrical Contractor* magazines.

I taught basic electricity courses at Southeast Community College and gave a presentation on the National Electrical Code at a LARC meeting several years ago. I have two copyrights: one for a book on bending conduit, and another on arc flash protection. I did go back to work after losing my leg, but after three weeks decided to retire.
