

LARC AT THE SE NE SEVERE WEATHER SYMPOSIUM

This year was the first time LARC had an information table at the Weather Symposium, on Saturday, April 6, on the Innovation Campus at UNL.

Booth volunteers distributed more than 75 brochures to those

interested in ham radio. Some were not aware of the difference between ham radio and citizen band radio. Some remembered when Hams helped out when the 911 system went down a number of years ago.

Hams stopped by to say "hello" and some were interested in learning more about ARES and were directed to the ARES information table. There were those who had an interest in SKYWARN® and others who just wanted to "get on the air." There

were also many requests on how to become involved with ham radio and what it takes to be licensed.

The most interest was generated once guests were able to make a radio contact. Our team placed a 2-meter Kenwood radio with a simple ground plane antenna on a re-purposed camera tripod in the hallway to make the contacts. Local Hams responded to the call from KDØPTR and talked to the on-air guests. Information was emailed to those who filled out a request form.

It was a good day for ham radio.
