

FIELD DAY: JUNE 22-23



Field Day is fast approaching. Make plans to participate and invite family and friends to Field Day.

For those new to Field Day, every June, Amateur Radio operators throughout North America and Canada set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate Amateur Radio's science, skill, and service to our communities and our nation. It combines public service, emergency preparedness, community outreach, technical skills, and contesting, all in a single event.



The Lincoln Amateur Radio Club will operate its official Field Day deployment from 1:00 pm Saturday, June 22,

until 1:00 pm Sunday, June 23, at Mahoney Park in Lincoln, 70th and Fremont Streets. Contesting will be conducted on 6, 15, 20, 40, and 80-meter voice, and Morse Code (CW).

The Field Day weekend is also a family time with picnics and watermelon. The LARC picnic will be held at the Mahoney Park north picnic shelter on Saturday at 6:00 pm. In Ham tradition, check-in is at 5:30 pm. The club will provide hamburgers, hot dogs, and drink. Members are asked to bring a salad, vegetable, or dessert to share. At 8:00 pm, enjoy cool slices of watermelon at the shelter.

Following the meal, at approximately 7:00 pm, there are tentative plans for a Morse Code demonstration at the shelter.

On Saturday afternoon, Mike Walsh, KBØQH, will provide instruction on how to set up an HF station, complete with grounding instructions. Please plan to attend as Mike is a seasoned Elmer.

Additionally, there are plans to make satellite contacts throughout the day and night, and 2-meter simplex operations will continue for the entire 24-hour period of Field Day.

The GOTA (Get On The Air) station will also be open and operating for 24 hours. GOTA coaches invite you and your family



to stop by and try your "voice" on highfrequency (HF) bands as well as 2 meters. The GOTA station is an opportunity for non-Hams, new Hams, and inactive Hams to key up, overcome "button fright," and experience the fun of Amateur Radio.

On Friday and Saturday, the 9:00 pm ARES 2-meter net will originate from the GOTA station tent.

On Saturday, there will be a transmitter (fox) hunt following the watermelon feed. This is a fun event for everyone. Prizes will be awarded following the initial hunt for first, second, and third place winners. Sign

STORM NET PROTOCOL

When being called out and accepting a point assignment, please remember the protocol we will be using moving forward.

- Check in to the net ONLY if you are able to take an assignment
- ◆ Check in with your full call sign only
- Wait to be acknowledged, and when you receive your assignment, safely move to your point
- When you arrive at your point, check in with your point number only and wait to be acknowledged
- Give your report and close that transmission with your call sign and point number.

This will greatly help the folks at the EOC as they are typing your information as you speak. Their reporting software is driven by the point number, not our call signs.
