## SILENT KEY: JAN PERRIN

Family of Jan Perrin



Jan Robert Perrin WAØNNB, 86, passed away on Tuesday, January 4, 2022, in Lincoln, Nebraska. He was born January 1, 1936, in Leon, Iowa, to Willard and Edna (Roldson) Perrin and was one

of five children. Jan is survived by his wife of 53 years, Janet (Hunzeker) Perrin and three sons, Gary, Greg (Erin), and Garret (Meghan). He also leaves five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his parents and a brother, Gary.

Jan graduated from Lincoln High School in 1954, where he liked to tell people he was a classmate of the famous TV personality Dick Cavett. Upon graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Army, where he served during the Korean War in Germany. He earned the rank of Sergeant First Class while assigned to the 265th Field Artillery Battalion that operated the M65 – 280 atomic cannon, also known as "Atomic Annie." While in the Army, he was awarded several distinctions: National Defense Service Medal, Army of Occupation Medal (Germany), Expert (M-1), and Good Conduct Medal/Sharpshooter (Carbine). He served in the Nebraska Army Reserves from 1957 through 1962. He was a member of the American Legion, Post #3 of Lincoln, Nebraska.

After his honorable discharge from the Army, he took an entry-level job repairing generators at the Surplus Center in Lincoln. He worked at the Surplus Center for over 30 years learning the business and working his

way up to the position of Buyer and General Sales Manager.

From 1970 through 1976, Jan taught fishing classes and organized fishing derbies for kids. A source of pride was teaching Tom Osborne how to fish for bass with a fly rod in Western Nebraska. In 1976, he was awarded the Voluntary Service Award from the Nebraska Parks and Recreation Department. In retirement, he kept busy by driving a school bus for the Lincoln Public Schools.

1964, Jan earned his ham radio license under the call sign WAØNNB. He was a long-time member of the Lincoln Amateur Radio Club and a lifetime member of the Amateur Radio Relay League (ARRL). His ham shack was full of QSL cards from all over the world.

In retirement, Jan enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren and gave them many rides on his riding lawn mower. He loved tinkering with electronics and building computers for his friends and family. He enjoyed swimming to stay healthy but would never miss an opportunity to stop for ice cream on the way home.

A celebration of life service was Saturday, January 15, at Messiah Lutheran Church, Lincoln. The graveside service was at Fairview Cemetery, 8400 Adams St., Lincoln. Memorials may be made to Clinic with A Heart, www.clinicwithaheart.org.

## SKYWARN TRAINING EVENT

three years since our last
training session at the Severe

Weather Symposium. For that reason, all spotters are required to attend a training session on Saturday, April 16, 2022, to recertify for deployment.

The new Lincoln Amateur Radio Club facility, 4420 NW 41<sup>st</sup> St., will be the location for this training session. It is in northwest Lincoln's Airpark industrial area. We hope to have the club station operational for tours, but please keep in mind this is a new installation, and we may not be fully functional by SKYWARN® training day.

We've booked an in-person presentation with Brian Smith, National Weather Service Warning Coordination Meteorologist.
Training event sponsors NeARES, Lincoln Amateur Radio Club, and Lancaster County Emergency Management Agency will have team members on-site to assist.

If you've previously completed "Role of the SKYWARN Spotter" and "Spotter Convective Basics" online courses, you're not required to retake them if you've submitted your certificate to me for our official records. However, retaking it as a refresher is recommended. Go to www. neares.net and find the links to these courses on the right-hand column. Please add Ed Holloway, KØRPT, as your instructor, and upon completion of these courses,

the system will email your completion certificate to me.

It has been a long time since we've issued Lancaster County Emergency Management ID cards, and we will resume this process on training day. The procedure includes completing a form, updating your ARES information, and taking your photo. Please bring your driver's license, as we'll need it to complete your registration. Your data will be securely stored and never shared or published online in any form.
