In early February, a solar storm destroyed 40 of 49 recently launched Starlink satellites. On February 15, a huge Coronal Mass Ejection (CME) was observed on the backside of the sun. Fortunately for us, it was not Earth-directed, as some scientists have stated that it would have been comparable to the Carrington Event, which is regarded as the largest solar storm in modern history.

For the March club meeting, we will be viewing videos about the Carrington Event, which occurred on September 1-2, 1859, and the storm of March 13, 1989, which blacked out the entire province of Quebec, Canada, leaving more than 6 million people without power.

HOA-FRIENDLY LIMITED-SPACE HF

Dave Hillman, WGØK

I was licensed in 1984 while living in Omaha. I worked for AT&T, and by the time I retired in 2002, my family and I had lived in four states and seven different houses. My wife was always supportive of our moves if she could pick out the house. She liked new houses, so consequently, we always were living with HOA restrictions.

I found HOA outdoor antenna restrictions a "fun" challenge. I have learned I can "work the world" with simple wire antennas. If you have access to your attic, that is the preferred option. In my current house in Lincoln, I have 12, 15, 17, and 20-meter dipoles in the attic. Each is fed with its own 50-ohm coax and brought down through the wall into my shack.

Some of the technical people say you can fan the dipoles and feed all of them with a single coax. My experience with that configuration results in a lot of RFI and SWR problems. You don't need a completely horizontal dipole. Put the center feed balun at the highest part of the attic and use the inverted V concept to allow the antennas to fit. Remember, on an inverted V dipole, the legs will be a little shorter than the formula indicates.

I also have a 40-meter dipole in the attic over my garage. You might say, "How do you get a 64' dipole above your garage?" It is not a true inverted V. I set the center feed at the highest point and then placed both legs of the dipole along the rafters in a "U" shape. I keep the wire from touching the rafters using ceramic insulators.

If you are going to put dipoles in your attic, I suggest two things: Don't run over 100 watts, as it will start getting into your electronics in the house. Secondly, use external tuners on each rig, such as the MFJ-969, which has a big inductor and helps get the SWR to a perfect 1:1 on each dipole for maximum efficiency.



DX Adventure Team



DX-Adventure is a joint venture of Max, ON5UR, and Erik, ON4ANN, and consists of 15 very enthusiastic people with all experience in participating or organizing a DX-pedition.

The first DX-Adventure project is therefore immediately ambitious:

- ◆ The Arctic Archipelago - Svalbard - IOTA EU026
- ◆ April 19–26, 2022
- ◆ The setup is to be active with five stations on all HF bands in different modes (CW, SSB, RTTY, FT8-FT4). In addition, we have the ambition to be the first to activate EU026 on QO-100. Three team members take on the challenge of driving a snowmobile all the way to Kapp Linné, about 100 km east of Longyearbyen.
- ◆ This is the only location that allows a "line of sight" on the QO-100 satellite. In addition, Kapp Linné is also on the edge of the satellite footprint - speaking of a challenge ...

TX5N DX-PEDITION TO RAIVAVAE, AUSTRAL ISLANDS

Perseverance DX Group

Several members of the Perseverance DX Group (PDXG) will activate Raivavae Island (Austral Islands), French Polynesia, April 15 – April 29, 2022 for approximately 12 operating days. The plan is to have radios on the air continually, as propagation allows.

The call sign TX5N was issued for this project. Team members include: Steve, W1SRD; Doris, KØBEE; Rob, N7QT; Melanie, N7BX; Heye, DJ9RR; Walt, N6XG; and Gene, K5GS. The team is planning to operate 160m – 10m (including 60m), CW, SSB and Digital.

The team will meet in Papeete, Tahiti, on April 12 and fly to Raivavae on April 15, returning to Papeete on April 29. The team expects to make between 60,000 – 80,000 QSOs.

AMATEUR RADIO IN UKRAINE ORDERED OFF THE AIR IN STATE OF EMERGENCY

FEBRUARY 24, 2022

A state of emergency was declared in Ukraine just prior to the Russian military invasion. Among other things, the February 24 decree from President Volodymyr Zelensky will remain in effect at least for 30 days and may be extended. As published on the website of the Verkhovna Rada, Ukraine's unicameral legislative body, the state of emergency includes regulation of TV and radio activities and "a ban on the operation of Amateur Radio transmitters for personal and collective use."

The decree also imposes a ban on mass events and on strikes and authorizes checking the documents of citizens, and if necessary, conducting searches on persons, vehicles, cargo, office space, and housing. A curfew could be imposed. "The situation changes rapidly," IARU Region 1 Secretary Mats Espling, SM6EAN, said. "IARU Region 1 continues to monitor the development and expect all radio amateurs to follow their national laws and regulations."
