PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

FCC, Title 47, Chapter 1, Subchapter D, Part 97 lists five reasons for Amateur Radio. In brief, they are to promote:

- Voluntary, non-commercial communications for the public, with emphasis on emergency communications.
- Advancement of the radio art.
- Encouragement and improvement of the Amateur service to advance radio communication and technical skills.
- Expansion in the number of trained operators, technicians, and electronics experts.
- Enhancement of international goodwill.

This list provides a reason for Amateur Radio, but they don't answer my "Why." I have a lot of reasons to be involved. I enjoy being involved in public service. I love technology and learning. I enjoy teaching and don't mind a good contest or two.

We have several upcoming opportunities that may help meet your "Why."

First up is Field Day. At its heart, Field Day is an emergency communications exercise, but it is much more. It is a wonderful opportunity to introduce people to the hobby, try a mode you haven't used before, spend time with others in the hobby, and most of all, enjoy some time with your radio.

In July is the Cornhusker State Games. These events provide time to practice our communications skills while assisting our community, and it also gives us a chance to show our community that Amateur Radio still has value.

Hot on the heels of the State Games is the Lancaster County Super Fair, where we again are afforded more time to practice our radio skills and interact with the community.

If your "Why" involves emergency communication, public service is an excellent opportunity to practice. When an emergency happens, it is too late to figure out how to use your equipment to communicate effectively. Take advantage of opportunities to practice now.

Congratulations to our new and upgraded licensees!

All new VE session examinees will be charged a \$15 administration fee by the ARRL (at the session) and an additional \$35 for new licenses, charged by the FCC. The \$35 charge will also apply to vanity call signs and license renewals. It does not apply to license upgrades or administrative changes like phone, email, or address updates.

The FCC will send the applicant an email, instructing them to pay the \$35 filing fee on a secure FCC website. Of note is that the personalized link accompanying this email will be valid only for 10 days from the date it is received.

Once the FCC receives payment, the license will be issued or denied where applicable. Most denials come when applying for a vanity call sign that has already been taken, but there may be other exceptions.

WHAT IS ARRL FIELD DAY?

ARRL



ARRL Field Day is the single most popular on-the-air event held annually in the U.S. and Canada. On the fourth weekend of June of each year, thousands of radio amateurs gather with their clubs, groups or simply with friends to operate from remote locations.

Field Day is a picnic, a campout, practice for emergencies, an informal contest and, most of all, FUN!

It is a time where many aspects of Amateur Radio come together to highlight our many roles. While some will treat it as a contest, other groups use the opportunity to practice their emergency response capabilities. It is an excellent opportunity to demonstrate Amateur Radio to the organizations that Amateur Radio might serve in an emergency, as well as the general public. For many clubs, ARRL Field Day is one of the highlights of their annual calendar.

The contest part is simply to contact as many other stations as possible and to learn to operate our radio gear in abnormal situations and less than optimal conditions.

We use these same skills when we help with events such as marathons and bike-a-thons; fund-raisers such as walk-a-thons; celebrations such as parades; and exhibits at fairs, malls and museums — these are all large, preplanned, non-emergency activities.

But despite the development of very complex, modern communications systems — or maybe because they ARE so complex — Amateur Radio has been called into action again and again to provide communications in crises when it really matters. Amateur Radio people (also called "Hams") are well known for our communications support in real disaster and post-disaster situations.

TECHNICIAN TEST POOL UPDATED

NCVEC Question Pool Committee

The new pool incorporates some significant changes compared to the 2018 – 2022 pool. Its 257 questions were modified slightly to improve wording or to replace distractors; 51 new questions were generated, and 62 questions were eliminated. This resulted in a reduction of 11 questions, bringing the total

number of questions in the pool from 423 to 412. The difficulty level of the questions is now more balanced, and the techniques and practices addressed have been updated.

The new 2022 – 2026 question pool is effective July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2026, and must be used for Technician-class license exams administered on or after July 1, 2022.

ARRL YOUTH LICENSING GRANT PROGRAM INFORMATION

ARRL

Beginning April 19, 2022, ARRL will cover the one-time \$35 application fee for new license candidates younger than 18-years old for tests administered under the ARRL Volunteer Examiner Coordinator (ARRL VEC) program.

The \$35 FCC application fee will be reimbursed after the ARRL VEC receives the completed reimbursement form and the new license has been issued by the FCC. The reimbursement check will be mailed to the fee payer. Also, candidates younger than 18-years old would pay a reduced exam session fee of \$5 to the ARRL VEC VE team at the time of the exam. The \$5 fee is for all candidates under the age of 18 regardless of the exam level taken. Proof of under 18 status is required at the session.

LINCOLN AMATEUR RADIO CLUB
