All new VE session examinees will be charged a \$15 administration fee by the ARRL (at the session) and an additional \$35 for new licenses, charged by the FCC. The \$35 charge will also apply to vanity call signs and license renewals. It *does not apply* to license upgrades or administrative changes like phone, email, or address updates.

The FCC will send the applicant an email, instructing them to pay the \$35 filing fee on a secure FCC website. Of note is that the personalized link accompanying this email will be valid for only 10 days from the date it is received.

Once the FCC receives payment, the license will be issued or denied where applicable. Most denials come when applying for a vanity call sign that has already been taken, but there may be other exceptions. More information is available at www.arrl.org/fcc-application-fee.

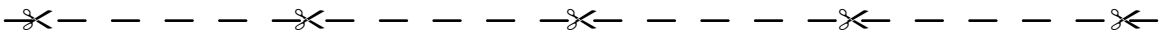
