PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

One way to measure an organization's vitality is participation. According to Club Express (clubexpress.com), the average club has 5% of members who run the

club and show up for almost every event, another 15% of members regularly participate, 20% occasionally participate, and the remaining 60% never show up for anything!

I am here to tell you that LARC is well above average, but we still have lots of room to grow. We are close to the 5% who run the club and show for everything, but our regular participation is closer to 25%, and our occasional participation is well above 50%. Those that never participate are in the minority.

The first step I see to strengthen LARC is to grow the core 5% to at least 10%. This would mean identifying at least 16 people to be regularly and deeply involved in the club.

How can we get there? First, we need more people to run for the Board. Bring your new ideas and passion for Amateur Radio. Four Board positions are opening up in December. Check page 5 for details on how you could become part of the Board.

Second, lead a committee. In January, the president is tasked with finding people to chair committees that drive LARC forward (review the list on page 2), and this daunting task often results in many of the same people chairing these committees each year.

You can change this! Reach out to a current Board member and let them know what committees interest you. In January, call the new president and tell them about your passion. If you don't want to chair a committee, that's OK. Many of these committees need other members, and there is room for everyone.

LARC membership is currently up over the last few years, participation is high, and we can strengthen LARC together. What will you do to boost our club's vitality?

LARC AWARDS

The award season is upon us. Submit requests and nominations, along with a paragraph about why your nominee deserves to be recognized, to Ed Holloway, KØRPT, k0rpt@arrl.net, by Monday, October 31. Award winners will be announced at the December holiday party.

JERRY COX AWARD

In the early 1950s, Jerry Cox, WØMAO, was without a doubt the most active Ham in the Lincoln area. Though disabled and in a wheelchair, he was on the air constantly, monitoring several frequencies and providing assistance where needed. Jerry became a silent key about 1960, and his mother thought it seemed fitting to recognize Amateur Radio operators who carried on his dedicated interest in ham radio. At that time the Jerry Cox Award came into being, it was sponsored by the Lincoln MARS Club.

The award is to be presented annually to a Ham whose interests closely followed Jerry's: excellent operating techniques, active in public service, and an interest in experimenting and exploring things of a technical nature. In addition, the Ham should be friendly to all and eager to help those who are new to the hobby. It is not designed to be a popularity contest. Nominees are to be made by fellow Hams and the recipient selected from those nominated. The recipient will have his or her name and call sign affixed to the award plaque, recognizing excellence in the Amateur Radio community.

ED WOERNER MENTORING AWARD

This award is presented to an individual who has acted as a mentor (or "Elmer") and helped other ham operators to advance in the hobby. By definition, a mentor is a wise and trusted counselor or teacher. Ham operators have a tradition of helping one another, and the Ed Woerner Award is given to one whose assistance has gone above and beyond what would have been expected. Nominations for this award are sought from Amateur Radio operators in the area; LARC membership is not necessary.

JERRY KOHN PUBLIC SERVICE AWARD

Jerry Kohn, WDØEGK, died of a stroke on November 2, 2008. Dr. Kohn was a family dentist to some club members, but to many more of us, he was the spark plug for numerous public service events. He was one of a handful of Hams who worked with the Cornhusker State Games every year since its inception in 1984.

There was seldom a public service event that Jerry missed. His volunteer hours total was either at the top or near the top of the list year after year. Jerry served on the LARC Board for 14 years, beginning in 1980. The Jerry Kohn Award was created in 2008 to recognize outstanding public service by a club member based on statistics showing total participation and other factors, such as total hours or bike miles.

AMATEUR RADIO HELPS DISABLED SAILBOAT TO PORT

On September 7, 2022, Jeanne (Jan) Socrates, VEØJS/MM / KC2IOV, and her sailboat, the SV Nereida, set sail from Cape Flattery, the northwesternmost point of the contiguous US. She was on her way to visit friends in San Francisco, California, but two days of 35 knot winds and storms left her sailboat disabled and her onboard

radio equipment marginally operational. Amateur operators in New Mexico, California, and Canada, and members of Group 7.155 heard her requests for assistance.

Gil Gray, N2GG, was able to contact Socrates on 40 meters. "Her power was extremely low, and she was unable to communicate on 14.300 MHz to notify the monitoring group on that frequency," said Gray. "She needed help with wind and sea conditions, and tidal data for San Francisco Bay," he added.

Low-power output on the HF radio made it very difficult to get Q5 copy, which would typically be Q2 or Q3. With the help of several software-defined radio (SDR) operators in Utah, California, and Maui, Hawaii, they were able to glean enough copy to understand her situation and answer questions for her navigation.

Gray; Jonathan Ayers, Al6NA; and Edwin E. Jenkins, K6EXY, are all experienced sailors. They were able to make periodic contact with Socrates and give her updated wind reports. Their last contact was on Monday, September 12, at 11:00 am (MSDT). By this time, Socrates was sailing with only the forward sail on her 38-foot sloop. Fortunately, a "following wind" kept her moving without a mainsail. As she approached the Golden Gate Bridge, Socrates was able to use the tidal information passed on by Amateur Radio operators to make it safely to Berkeley Marina in San Francisco Bay.

"I wouldn't call it a rescue," said Socrates, "just good Amateur Radio assistance — and I'm grateful for their help."

Socrates is 81 years old and the oldest person to have ever sailed around the world unassisted. Once her sailboat is repaired, she will sail again, not for records, but for the enjoyment of sailing the high seas.

Her situation is one of three events in early September in which Amateur Radio was able to provide emergency assistance.

HURRICANE WATCH NET UPDATE FOR IAN - UPDATED 9/29

The Hurricane Watch Net (HWN) has been in operation since the morning of September 27, 2022, as Hurricane Ian swept across Cuba and headed toward Florida's Gulf Coast. The HWN continues to operate on both 14.325 and 7.268 MHz as propagation permits. The 20-meter net resumed at 8:00 am Eastern Time on

Thursday, September 29, and will continue until further discussion and conditions warrant closing-down the net.

At 5 am EDT on Thursday, the National Hurricane Center (NHC) reported that Ian is now a tropical storm located 40 miles southeast of Orlando, Florida, with maximum sustained winds of 65 mph. Ian is moving toward the northeast near eight mph, and is still expected to produce strong winds, heavy rains, and storm surge across portions of Florida, Georgia, and the Carolinas. "On the forecast track, the center of Ian is expected to move off the east-central coast of Florida later today and then approach the coast of South Carolina on Friday. The center will move farther inland across the Carolinas Friday night and Saturday," included the report.

As the storm moves toward the Atlantic, and then back into the coastal states, the focus of the HWN will change to receiving damage reports for the National Hurricane Center, handling messages for Emergency Operation Centers, and other agencies. The HWN will also assist Salvation Army SATERN Net partners to move health and welfare communications traffic out of the affected areas.

"We appreciate the cooperation of amateur operators and nets in allowing us clear frequencies to make these important contacts as Florida and the southern states work to recover," said HWN Assistant Net Manager Stan Broadway, N8BHL.

The HWN disseminates the latest advisories issued by the National Hurricane Center in Miami, Florida. The net also obtains real-time ground-level weather conditions and initial damage assessments from Amateur Radio operators in the affected area and relays that information to the NHC by way of WX4NHC, and when required, the Canadian Hurricane Centre.
