Thank you for a very productive and successful year! Here is a small sample of this year's accomplishments.

In public service, we logged 6,406 miles, with a combined time of 1,573 hours. The Cornhusker State Games led in mileage, with 3,451 miles, while the most hours was for the Lancaster County Fair, with 323 hours. For Skywarn®, we logged 1,066 miles and a total of 139 Hours. Ninety-one volunteers helped out, and I know of many more that wanted to help but were unable due to circumstances beyond their control. All I can say is thank-you!

LARC has a place to call home. With the support of the Lincoln Airport Authority and generous donors, LARC has access to the old Lancaster County Corrections Facility with plenty of space for education, meetings, Field Day, a new club station, and more. Congratulations to the Hams and those who have upgraded their skills this year.

I can keep listing accomplishments, but there isn't enough space for them all. Thank you for being a part of LARC and making 2022 a successful year!

Examples of Excellence: Trends in Training

ARRL

Excerpts from an article from the December 2022 QST by Rick Palm (K1CE) on Public Services.

“The last few years have born witness to an accelerated evolution of amateur radio public service operator training and exercises, resulting in new levels of competency and recognition by professional emergency management and non-governmental organizations such as the American Red Cross.”

Training Exercises between amateur radio and Emergency Management and response organizations took place across the country. Some areas were in Southern California, the Pacific Northwest, the Southeastern US with FEMA, and statewide in Florida. Exercises included such things as Post Earthquake Bridge Inspections, setting up EOCs, and simulated communications outages from cyberattacks and weather emergencies.

Results are ushering in a “New Era for Amateur Radio in Emergency Communications. Amateur Services is being elevated to new heights of opportunity, professionalism, and acceptance by the public emergency management community at all levels.”
