## **Silent Keys**

### **Harold E. Kunkee, 1930 - 2022**

It is with a sad and heavy heart to report that Harold (HAL) Kunkee, KØKTZ, has become a Silent Key. This is a very sad day for LARC and the Amateur Radio community.

Harold E. Kunkee, 92, of Lincoln, NE, passed away December 4, 2022. He was born January 6, 1930, at David City, NE, to Albert and Edna (Jones) Kunkee. He grew up on a farm and was a graduate of David City High School.

In 1952, Harold served in the US Army in front of the Main Line of Resistance as a signalman in Korea. He was a Goodyear employee for 36 years, retiring in 1991. Harold was a member of Havelock United Methodist Church, Lincoln Amateur Radio Club, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Amateur Radio was an important way that Harold, KØKTZ, served his community. A member of LARC and LRC from their beginnings in 1953, Hal served in many capabilities. He served on the Board of Directors for both organizations and in one year, the President of LARC.

Hal maintained the Lunch Bunch Net on both 146.850 LRC and 146.76 LARC repeaters where they actually met and decided what restaurant the group would

meet that day. He served as the person who would help folks renew their license and for me, Ed, KØRPT, to get my vanity, He thought it was the perfect callsign for me.

Hal served as a VEC and helped with Skywarn, ARES, and many public service events every year such as the Lincoln Marathon and Toy's for Tots (one of his favorites). Hal served as a Repeater Control operator for many years for 146.850, 146.760, 145.145, and 147.045, and also the 444.100 and 444.300 repeaters. He was honored in 1994 and 2016 with the Lifetime Achievement Award and he always loved helping people become involved in ham radio.

Harold Kunkee is survived by his wife Joan, son David, and daughter-in-law Elizabeth, grandchildren John and Leah, all of Manhattan Beach, CA; sister Dolores Zimmer, Wheaton, MN, and brother Lyle Kunkee, Clarkson, NE. He was preceded in death by his infant son, sisters Lola Mastera and Lois Hall, and brother Wesley Kunkee.

Ham radio has certainly lost one of the best, and we, in our community, has lost one of the greats. The Hals of this world are very few and far between.

## ***Dianna J. May, 1946 - 2022***

Dianna J. May, age 76, of Lincoln, Nebraska, passed away after an accidental fall at home on Saturday, December 10th, 2022. Dianna was born on July 10, 1946, to Werner and Lois (Halferty) Selene in Storm Lake, Iowa.

Dianna grew up in Hampton, Iowa, and graduated from Hampton Community High School in 1964. For the next three years she attended Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa, where she majored in French and Education. On April 8th, 1967, Dianna married her high school sweetheart and love of her life, Stephen O. May in Hampton, Iowa. Steve was drafted to serve in the U.S. Army in Vietnam in 1967. After he was discharged, Steve accepted a job with Honeywell in Lincoln, Nebraska, where they moved in 1969, and lived for the remainder of their lives. Their marriage was blessed with the birth of a daughter and son. Just four days after celebrating their 45th wedding anniversary, Dianna lost her beloved Steve to a heart attack in 2012.

After staying home with her young children for several years, Dianna worked as a classroom and health paraprofessional for Lincoln Public Schools, from 1977 until 1988. Dianna and Steve were volunteers with the Cornhusker State Games for many years, and Dianna served as the office manager for the State Games Office, from 1988-1989. She worked

subsequently for eight years as the secretary for Second Baptist Church in Lincoln. She then worked for five years as the secretary for Sheridan Lutheran Church in Lincoln. She worked for a year as the office manager for Dr. Jerry B. Kohn before working as a customer service representative for Dr. Leonard's Healthcare/Carol Wright Gifts for three years before retirement.

For over 50 years, Dianna was a member of the National T.T.T. Society, a philanthropic organization, which provides funds annually to clothe and send deserving young girls to summer camp. At the national level, she served as Treasurer (1991-1993), and Vice-President (1995-1997). She served as Nebraska State President (1984-1986), and held all offices in her local chapter. For several years, she was editor of *Tidings*, the organization's national quarterly magazine. In celebration of the organization's 100th Anniversary, Dianna co-wrote the third verse of the T.T.T. Song.

Dianna was licensed as a General Class amateur radio operator since 1977. Along with her husband Steve, Dianna made innumerable contributions to the Lincoln community through amateur radio. She assisted in disaster services and storm awareness for Lancaster County Emergency Management, and she served as a radio communicator for many public service events. In recognition of her service, Dianna received the Jerry Cox Memorial Award

in 1985 for making significant contributions to the amateur radio community. Dianna was an active member of the Lincoln Amateur Radio Club (LARC). She served on the Board of Directors as Secretary, Treasurer, and was and still is the only female President (2006) of the Board. For over 20 years, Dianna assisted in typing, laying out, editing, and proofreading *The Lincoln LOG*, which is the club's monthly newsletter.

In addition to her service to the Lincoln community through LARC, Dianna was active in the local chapter of the American Red Cross. She participated on the Red Cross First Aid team and disaster action team. She was trained in shelter management, mass care and feeding, and disaster welfare inquiry. She was also certified in first aid and CPR.

Dianna was an active supporter and adult member of the Girl Scouts of the USA, especially during the years when her daughter was a Brownie and Girl Scout. She was a Brownie troop leader for three years, a neighborhood chairman for one year, and a health aide for the Homestead Girl Scout Council Day Camp for one summer.

Dianna was an accomplished percussionist and pianist. Throughout her life, she maintained her interest in music, and she enjoyed playing the piano for her own and her family's enjoyment. For several years, she assisted with the Sunday school music program at her

church as an accompanist, and served as music leader for preschool and vacation bible school. She also enjoyed playing hand bells and timpani in church services, and playing piano for parties, as well as singing in the adult and treble choirs at church.

Later in life, she enjoyed watching movies and her favorite television shows, and talking on the telephone with friends and family. She enjoyed the upgrades that her son, Kurt, completed around the home that she shared with Kurt after Steve's passing. She had great fun crafting greeting cards with her daughter, Kris. She delighted in visiting Kris at her home in Iowa City, where they attended craft fairs, farmer's markets, stamp club workshops, and the Iowa City Jazz Festival. Dianna also enjoyed traveling with Kris to Madison, Wisconsin to visit her brother, Alan, and his wife Mary Beth.

Dianna is survived by her loving children, Kristine Williams and Kurt May; grandchildren, Liam Williams, Brandon May and Trista "Ren" May; brother, Alan (Mary Beth Growney) Selene and his daughters, Wendy, Jessica, Bridget, and their families; and many other relatives and friends. Dianna was preceded in death by her parents and her husband, Stephen O. May.
