You can check the status of your 2023 LARC membership by looking at your LOG address label or contacting the treasurer at treasurer@larc.org. If you haven't renewed for 2023, now is a great time. Use the form on the back page of this LOG, the online form at <https://k0kkv.org/membership>, or bring your dues to the next club meeting. LARC memberships are based on the calendar year, January through December. Your participation and membership are critical to keeping LARC relevant and healthy.

While you are verifying your LARC membership, now is also a great time to check the status of your Amateur Radio license. Ham licenses are valid for ten years. It's easy to forget when renewals are due, and the FCC does not mail expiration notifications.

This information is available online at <https://wireless2.fcc.gov/UlsApp/UlsSearch/searchLicense.jsp>. Enter your call sign in the search box and click search. The page will return the status of your call sign and its expiration date.

Be aware that upgrading your license, such as going from a Tech to a General, does not change your license expiration date. However, obtaining a vanity call does extend the expiry date of your license.

Renewals can be done online up to 90 days before they expire. If your license has expired, don't despair; you can renew up to two years after the expiration and keep your call sign and privileges. If it has been over two years, you will have to retake the Technician exam and be issued a new call sign. If you need help, reach out.

Remember to get on the air. The bands are open.

The Leg Notes

John Huseman, WDØEZI

And Jonna Huseman

This is the story of the creation of the Leg Notes written by John Huseman, (WDØEZI), and his daughter Jonna for the benefit of others who had a leg amputation.

LARC editor

Before my first amputation about seven years ago, I was in the hospital planning on surgery the next morning. I was scared to death. My daughter works in Washington, DC, with a young woman whose husband had lost his foot serving in Afganistan. She asked him to give me a call. After talking to this soldier I knew I was going to make it.

Later, as I met other leg amputees, I learned they had no one to talk to. I started making a few “leg notes”. This turned into several typed pages.

The contents included information on such things as post-surgery medical care and healing, keeping the skin clean, how to care for breaks in the skin, and supplies needed. Also included were instructions on washing the liner and sleeve of the prosthesis and how to make a drying stand out of PVC pipe. Things like that.

Then I learned from my “Leg Guy” and my daughter Jonna, that about 2,000 soldiers from Ukraine were in the US to get prosthetic legs. They do not have access to this technology in their home country.

There were two locations in the US fitting the soldiers with new legs - the

Protez Foundation in Ogden, MN, and the Medical Center Orthotics and Prosthetics in Silver Springs, MD.

I called both of the locations and asked them if they would like copies of my leg notes. They said “YES”. Jonna, my daughter, is a journalist. She took my “Leg Notes”, totally rewrote them and did a lot of editing. The soldiers from Ukraine have interpreters, plus Jonna found an interpreter. We mailed the finished notes to the locations in Maryland and Minnesota.



The Nebraska Sandhill Crane Spring Migration, is among the greatest wildlife spectacles on the continent. There is no better place, to observe the migration, than the Platte River valley in central Nebraska. Roughly one million cranes fly through from mid February to mid April, with the largest numbers observed in late March.
