President's Message

Spring may have finally reached Nebraska! Green lawns and blooming flowers remind us of an increased chance of severe weather. It also means that public service season is starting soon, and

the Nebraska ARRL Convention is almost here. The first public service event of the year is the Lincoln Marathon on Sunday, May 7. On its heels is the Nebraska ARRL Convention on Saturday, May 13 (See <http://www.lincolnhamfest.org/> for details). Check out the complete list of events later in the LOG.

With signs of severe weather popping up more frequently, now is a great time to focus on the role of the Lincoln Amateur Radio Club in the event of a disaster. LARC is an American Radio Relay League (ARRL) affiliated club. This means LARC is an ARRL supporting club and consequently tightly tied to the ARRL emergency services known as the Amateur Radio Emergency Services or ARES®. The well-known slogan, "When all else fails,"® is a registered trademark of ARES. In Lancaster County, ARES is recognized by Lincoln-Lancaster County

Emergency Management Agency (LLCEMA) as the official Amateur Radio organization for providing emergency communications during a disaster or other emergency. So, what is LARC's role? It supports the efforts of ARES. This means sponsoring ARES functions such as storm spotting and emergency education and providing resources such as the repeater for communications. ARES is the channel through which LARC provides emergency communications and disaster services in Lancaster County.

Locally, ARES is best known for storm spotting, but that is only one of its services. Here are a couple of examples of other ways ARES has helped locally:

- In April 2010, the local 911 system failed. At the request of Lancaster County officials, ARES stationed ham radio operators at major intersections across town.
- In the aftermath of the EF-4 Hallam tornado, ARES volunteers performed initial damage assessments, post disaster relief operations, and provided critical information to county emergency officials.

In March, 2023, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), released a final version of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Functional Guidance. The guidance, which provides a framework for communications resources within incident management, officially includes support from amateur radio operators. The expanded Communications Unit (COMU) structure now includes the Auxiliary Communicator (AUXC) role, which covers personnel from services that provide communications support to emergency management, public safety, and other government agencies. **This includes amateur radio.**

NIMS guides government, non-governmental organizations, and the private sector to work together to prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters and other emergencies. “This is a major step in the recognition of the need and usefulness of amateur radio and other communications services in our national preparedness”, said Josh Johnson, KE5MHV, Director of Emergency Management for ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® “It also gives official guidance to pave the way for future training and education of volunteers in ARRL’s Amateur Radio Service® (ARES)®, Johnson added.
