Amateur Radio and Earth-Moon-Earth Communications Doug Buhrman, KØDSP

How Amateur Radio Works (HARW) Bryan Leavitt, WOBCL


Impedance is resistance to AC flow, and as such it can and does vary according to the frequency of the signal. When working with transmitters, transmission cables, and antennas it is important that the impedance of all the components match each other as close as possible.

Maximum power is transferred when impedance's match. When there is a mismatch some of the power is not transferred to the cable and/or antenna, but is reflected in the opposite direction from the outgoing signal. The ratio of the outgoing power to the reflected power creates standing waves on the transmission line and is call the Standing Wave Ratio or SWR for short. A SWR of 1:1 indicates a perfect impedance match and therefore maximum power transfer, a higher ratio indicates that some of the outgoing signal is reflected.

Most modern semiconductor radios start to reduce their output power when the SWR gets above 2:1 and drastically reduce power above 3:1. According to chart 1, 33% of the voltage and 11% of the power are reflected when the SWR is 2:1. At 3:1, 50% of the voltage and 25% of the power are reflected. The reflected power can end up in a number of places; it can be lost in the feed line, heating it in the process; it can return to the transmitter and potentially damage it; it can be re-reflected from the radio and return to the antenna; it can be on the outside casing of the radio and/or on connecting cables in the shack, (this is why it is very important for all the equipment in your shack to be solidly grounded); and there are many other possibilities not mentioned here.

Because a reflected signal can return to the antenna and be transmitted, it can cause an echo or ghosting which can degrade the original and interfere with data, voice, and image transmissions.

It is possible to have a poor match at the antenna, but have a low SWR at the transmitter. This is usually due to high losses in the transmission cable.
