An examination of Lincoln's chaotic 2Ø24 severe weather season, featuring the April 26 Lincoln/Waverly tornado and the July 31 severe wind event. This advanced storm spotter training will break down the meteorological setup, storm evolution, and real-world spotting techniques used during these high-impact events. Nebraska YL Ham of the Year. Any female ham radio operator age 18 or older as of 12/31/2024 who has contributed to the art of Amateur Radio in the State of Nebraska.

Young Ham of the Year. Any ham radio operator, male or female, age 18 or younger as of 12/31/2024 who has contributed to the art of Amateur Radio in the State of Nebraska.


General Class Is A Hit - Not Too Late To Join
